INDEMNITY - Trail-bike riding contains inherent risk of injury. While the Onga Onga School and its Board of Trustees has made every effort to address foreseeable safety issues parents and guardians are put on notice that all risks cannot be foreseen and eliminated. To the Onga Onga School and its Board of Trustees; I the undersigned declare that:

1. I understand and acknowledge that some of the activities for which I am participating in will be physically and emotionally demanding; and may involve a significant risk of physical injury, death and property damage.
2. I hereby assume all responsibility for any injury, death or property damage whilst participating or arising from the event whether caused by negligence or otherwise;
3. I accept that the Onga Onga School and its Board of Trustees reserves the right to refuse my participation in this event based on my skill level, motorcycle condition or safety equipment.
4. I acknowledge that the motorcycle/four-wheeler I have entered for this Trail Ride is in good condition and complies with all the rules as set down by the Onga Onga School and its Board of Trustees;
5. I authorise the Onga Onga School and its Board of Trustees, including volunteers to arrange medical treatment and emergency evacuation services on my behalf and at my cost, in the event of my injury or illness, as it deems necessary. I understand that the Onga Onga School, its Officials and volunteers will endeavour to keep my bike, equipment, personal items safe but that they accept no responsibility for the safekeeping of those items;
6. I understand and acknowledge neither the Onga Onga School and its Board of Trustees, including volunteers and landowners which the Onga Onga School has agreed over whose land this Trail Ride is to run, will be held responsible for any injury or loss of life to persons or any machine loss, failure or breakage, during, preceding or following these day's events, or any litigation which may be forthcoming from this event in respect of injury, death or damage, and I agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Onga Onga School, its Board of Trustees, including volunteers and Landowners against any such claims.

ONGA ONGA SCHOOL – SAT 17TH MARCH 2012 TRIAL BIKE RIDE GUIDELINES



Our ride is designed for trail riders looking for the ultimate trail riding experience. However, whilst trail riding is a fun sport filled with freedom, it is also a fairly high risk activity so there has to be some rules to keep everyone safe!

RULES OF ENGAGEMENT – All participants, spectators, supporters and volunteers are invited guests and are expected to follow the directions of marshals and adhere to the following safety rules listed here or given at the rider safety briefing.

- **SAFETY BRIEFING** - All riders shall attend the Riders Briefing and check out when finished or leaving the trail.
- **RIDE RULES** - This is a fully guided one way trail ride. Riders will follow our “lead rider” who will set the pace for the following group members and our “sweep riders” will follow at the rear. Road rules apply on all roads. Do not pass the lead rider and please ride within your capabilities and vision.
- **PROTECTIVE CLOTHING** - In the interests of safety all riders SHALL wear the correct safety gear when riding including helmet, boots that cover the ankle, (no gumboots), long sleeved top and strong long trousers. (Gloves, goggles, knee pads, kidney belt and body armour are strongly recommended)
- **BIKE PRE-OPERATION CHECKLIST** - Refer to the manufacturer’s instructions for your particular motor bike and four wheeler for the correct specifications (for example, tyre pressure, and the correct engine temperature for checking the oil).
- **MOTOR BIKES & FOUR WHEELERS** - It is expected that all ALL motor bikes and four wheelers will be in sound condition, structurally and mechanically, and they must have adequate mufflers, functional brakes and good off road tyres. All motor bikes and four wheelers will be scrutinised before the ride.
- **FUEL & EQUIPMENT** - You are required to bring your own fuel, toolkit/spares for your bike. Under no circumstances are dogs, Alcohol, or Firearms allowed.
- **APPROVED FUEL CONTAINERS** - It is a fire safety requirement of the Rural Fire Authority that any fuel loaded on the Fuel Truck is to be stored in an approved Fuel Container. Absolutely, positively NO Fuel Containers will be accepted onto the Fuel Truck that is not in an approved fuel container. The Fuel truck will meet us at our lunch stop about 60/70 odd km into ride.
- **PILLION RIDERS** - One Rider per Bike/Four wheeler - No pillion riders allowed.
- **SUPERVISION** - All children brought with you to this bike ride are your responsibility and they must be actively supervised and have an adult with them at all times.
- **BREAKDOWNS** - If you BREAK DOWN push your bike off the trail to be safe, but stay with your bike until found by an Official or send another rider for help. Breakdown assistance in the unlikely event of mechanical failure. A recovery trailer will be dispatched where possible to help transfer your bike/quad to the nearest road. Whereby the rider will be responsible for its care and collection.
- **SAFETY & RESCUE** - We will have a number of Officials and our paramedic and First Aid Response team on the trip who will sweep the track to enhance security and safety, and provide first aid as required.
- **INJURIES & ACCIDENTS** - If you are INJURED, stay with your bike until found by an Official or our First Aid Response team. Try to make yourself safe and comfortable. Any rider that comes across an accident scene must stop to (1) Assist the injured rider, (2) Secure the accident scene to ensure that the oncoming riders cannot hit the injured person or bystanders and (3) Send another rider to get medical help. If you think you may have been reported injured, but make it back to base, please report in to say that you are back safe.
- **AMBULANCE** - Due to the isolation of the event and potential high costs of emergency Ambulance services, it is strongly recommended that all attendees be a member of the St John Supporter Scheme. As a St John Supporter you’ll receive free medical emergency attendance and transport to hospital anywhere in New Zealand, regardless of whether you have an accident or an emergency.
- **CHANGE OF CONDITIONS** - The organising committee and its officials reserve the right to add to or alter or change any factors relating to the ride at any stage up and including the day of the ride without prior consent or notification.
- **INTERPRETATION OF RULES** - In any dispute as to the interpretation of any rule, the decision of the organising committee and its marshals is final.
- **CLAIMS** – Any entrant’s claim is limited to the amount of entry fee paid.
- **INSURANCES** - While the event is insured protecting the Onga Onga School and its Board of Trustees, including Volunteers and Landowners, this insurance **does not** include the participants. It is therefore strongly recommended that participants hold their own private third party accident insurance to limit their own personal liability.
- **LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY** – All participants will be required to sign an indemnity when registering for the event.
- **NOTE TO RIDERS** – The organising committee and its officials reserve the right without explanation or the refund of any portion of the entry fee, to refuse admission to or eject any person(s) whose conduct is deemed to be disorderly, who’s language is vulgar or who fails to comply with these or other event rules.



CANCELLATION - If the ride is to be cancelled due to extreme weather conditions, a cancellation notice will be placed on **Silver Bullet** and announcements will be made over **Radio Central FM**, and other HB radio station’s from about **6.00 am** on **Sat 17th March 2012**
